UPCOMING EVENTS

Friday Fun Teams night 12 July:

This is a last reminder for registering your interest in participating in the Fun Teams night on Friday 12 July (lucy.mini@hotmail.com or text 021 126 0922). During the last couple of days leading up to the 12 July we will be aiming to finalise the teams and ensuring we have an even number of teams in each section. However, in case of shortage of players on the day, we will need to have a list of stand-by players who can at short notice make themselves available to play. Usually, we will contact members as a reminder of the help needed for the Fun Teams night to be a successful event.

Training opportunities:

Advanced Improver Lessons:

For the last three years, in the middle of the year, we have held Sunday afternoon lessons, based on *NZ Bridge Improver Lessons*, aimed mainly at Junior and Intermediate players.

This year, it has been suggested that we run *NZ Bridge Intermediate Lessons*, aimed mainly at Senior, Senior Reserve and experienced Intermediate players. Four lessons will be run on a Friday night and five on a Sunday afternoon, when the club rooms are available. The cost is \$5 per lesson, and lessons will start at 7.00pm on a Friday and 2.00pm on a Sunday. They will run for two hours; one hour of lesson and one hour of play.

Friday 19 July – NZB Lesson 4 – Combatting opponent's interference over our 1NT bid

Friday 2 August – NZB Lesson 5 – Competing over opponent's 1NT opening bid

Sunday 18 August – NZB Lesson 6 – Competitive Bidding, when we open the bidding

Friday 23 August – NZB Lesson 7 – Competitive bidding, when we overcall

Sunday 8 September – NZB Lesson 8 – Michaels Cue Bid and Unusual 2NT overcalls

Sunday 22 September – NZB Lesson 9 – High Level Bidding

Friday 11 October – NZB Lesson 10 – Defence against opponent's Pre-emptive Opening Bids

Sunday 20 October – NZB Lesson 13 – Splinters and Roman Key Card Blackwood.
